In every country in the world, women and girls suffer discrimination that can leave them poorer, excluded from education, vulnerable to gender-based violence and child marriage.

A gift in your Will can help women and girls overcome these barriers, so they can take their rightful place in society.

You can help future generations of mothers like Lionah in Zimbabwe. With the support of a self-help group funded in part by gifts in Wills, Lionah and her fellow women in the village learnt about their legal and human

rights, as well as taking part in vital education on sexual health, hygiene, and sanitation.

LEAVING A GIFT IN YOUR WILL IS EASY

We all need a Will. It's the best way to ensure that our wishes are carried out in the event of our death.

Once you have taken care of your own family, a gift to Oxfam in your Will helps take care of your global family. Your gift will show those you love the values most important to you justice, fairness, dignity for all. Your example encourages others to join you in working for a fairer world.

We recommend you speak to your solicitor to make sure your wishes can be carried out in the way you would like. And, of course, our team is on hand to answer any questions you may have.

There are three main ways you can remember your global family with a gift to Oxfam in your Will. You can...

- Include a percentage of the remainder of your estate. This is known as the "residue". After you have provided for your friends and family, you can leave a percentage of the remainder of your estate to Oxfam. Any percentage will make a huge difference and this kind of gift won't lose its value over time.
- Nominate a percentage of your estate that you would like Oxfam to receive. It can be as little as 1% and as big as 100% and this gift will also keep its value over time.
- Leave a specific amount of money, real estate or shares to Oxfam — this is known as a pecuniary gift.

WHAT DOES YOUR WILL NEED TO SAY?

To keep things simple, we've provided some helpful wording that you can share with your solicitor in order to include a gift to Oxfam in your Will.

"I give, devise and bequeath, free of all duties and taxes *<_____> to Oxfam Australia (ABN 18 055 208 636) of 130–138 Leicester Street, Carlton, Victoria 3053 (or its successor organisation) for its general purposes. An authorised receipt from Oxfam Australia will be a sufficient discharge for the executor(s) or trustee without seeing the final distribution."

*insert one of the following:

- The whole (or ...%) of the residue of my estate.
- The whole (or ...%) of my estate.
- The sum of \$(amount).
- (Details of a particular asset such as shares or property).

Already have a Will?

If you already have a Will and would now like to include a gift to Oxfam, all you have to do is contact your solicitor to add a "codicil" to your Will, which is an amendment to your exisiting Will.

YOUR QUESTIONS ANSWERED

I don't have a Will. Should I get one?

Everyone should have a valid Will. It's the only way to ensure our wishes are carried out when we pass away. We recommend you speak to a solicitor so you can rest assured you have a professionally written Will.

I already have a Will but I would like to include Oxfam now. Can I?

Yes. To update an existing Will with a gift to Oxfam, you need to add a "codicil" which is an amendment to your exisiting Will. Your solicitor can help you with this.

Don't you have to be rich to include a charity in your Will?

More and more people choose to include a charity like Oxfam in their Will. Any gift, large

or small, can make a huge difference to ending poverty and building a fairer future. Of course, family comes first, and if you are worried about leaving a specific or pecuniary gift, you can leave a percentage of your estate.

How will my gift be used?

Your gift will be used where it is most needed, to achieve the greatest impact at the time of your passing. If you wish to support one area of work, such as girls' education or clean water, give us a call on 1800 088 110 before visiting your solicitor.
